Every child was beaming with happiness and thoroughly enjoying the event. Kids had a great time exploring nature and then enjoying a tasty supper. The day was even more captivating because of the incredible music and our children carefree dancing.



The following day, on October 19th, our three children had the opportunity to meet with Nepalese model and Miss Nepal World 2018, Shrinkhala Khatiwada. The Nepal Initiative, an LHFN partner, arranged the gathering. The major reason for allowing these children to meet her was to encourage them, as she is not just a beauty pageant winner, but also a well-known Nepalese architect. Construction of a building.....

A delegation of thirty-two individuals from World Servants, a partner organization of LHFN based in the Netherlands, visited us on October 14, 2023, with the goal of constructing a house for a Christian Community School classroom in Mulpani.



The LHFN team facilitated and cared for the team, which was housed in the Blue Building. The team was there for the house's construction, which was carried out under a contract with Melbin Construction and Suppliers. Ms. Roshna Karki, the project coordinator for World Servants, handled all of the administration and translation work, Mr. Sameer was on-site at the construction site and facility, and Ms. Januka Magar assisted with all of the necessary financial supply.

We have all been greatly impressed by the commitment and hard work of the Dutch team, as they dedicate their efforts to improving the lives of impoverished and disadvantaged children.



Not only did they build the house, but they also ran a children's program, which influenced our children to grow in the Lord and rely on Jesus.

Even though it was festival season in Nepal, building supplies were delivered on time so that work could continue. The two rooms of the building were completed for construction, and the team from the Netherlands handed it over to the LHFN management on October 26th, 2023, in the presence of LHFN's, Educate Nepal's board members, staffs, and church leaders.
