
## MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT

# WHAT EXACTLY IS LIGHT HOUSE FOUNDATION NEPAL?

Light House Foundation Nepal (LHFN) was registered as a non-governmental and non-profit organization at the district administration office in Kathmandu on October 11, 2009, under the Organization Registration Act of 2034 Nepal, Article 4 (Registration No. 414). LHFN aims to protect and improve the lives of destitute and socially marginalized children who are vulnerable to or have been victims of human trafficking and sexual abuse. LHFN prioritizes providing safe accommodation, nurturing childcare and quality education, giving at-risk, impoverished children the skills and opportunities to become active and valued members of the community.

LHFN works in close collaboration with the Central Children Welfare Board (CCWB), Social Welfare Council (SWC), and District Development Committee (DDC), the key government organizations in the fields of child protection, education and welfare.

Every human being on this planet is entitled to a life of dignity devoid of discrimination, abuse, and exploitation in any form. Safeguarding these rights is essential, as articulated by multiple domestic and global human rights accords, such as the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (the SDGs). LHFN is closely aligned with SDGs 3, 4, 5 and 10:



What we do for ourselves dies with us. What we do for others and the world remains and is immortal.

# VISION

To give vulnerable, poverty-stricken, oppressed and socially excluded children the opportunity to grow up in a safe and caring environment, where they are nurtured, educated, encouraged, respected and loved.

## MISSION

To improve the livelihood, and wellbeing of Nepali children who are at risk of trafficking, abuse and neglect. This is done by providing holistic care i.e. accommodation, education, nutrition, healthcare and a supportive and secure environment for emotional development.

## CORE VALUES

The work of Light House Foundation Nepal is based on core values that focus on a child's development in a supporting community environment. The approach of the Foundation is child focused, family based and community centered.

- We were truly honoured by the visit of Tina Tan-Leo, widely known as "Singapore's original style queen", and her husband Lionel, an accomplished architect and recently dubbed one of "Asia's most stylish men" by Tatler magazine. - In March, the Frost family from the UK visited us to meet our children and learn more about our activities. They also brought several large bags of clothes, for which we were extremely grateful. And in December, their two children organised a 10 km walk to raise money for LHFN. The visit had a powerful impact on the whole family: "We were extremely fortunate to meet the incredible people at LHFN, who show endless kindness and commitment to improve the education and welfare of the lives of children in Nepal. and discuss her career. She encouraged the girls to follow their dreams, but also emphasised the importance of a good education and developing skills relevant to building a viable career.

# CHILDREN'S STORIES

## GEETA KHATRI

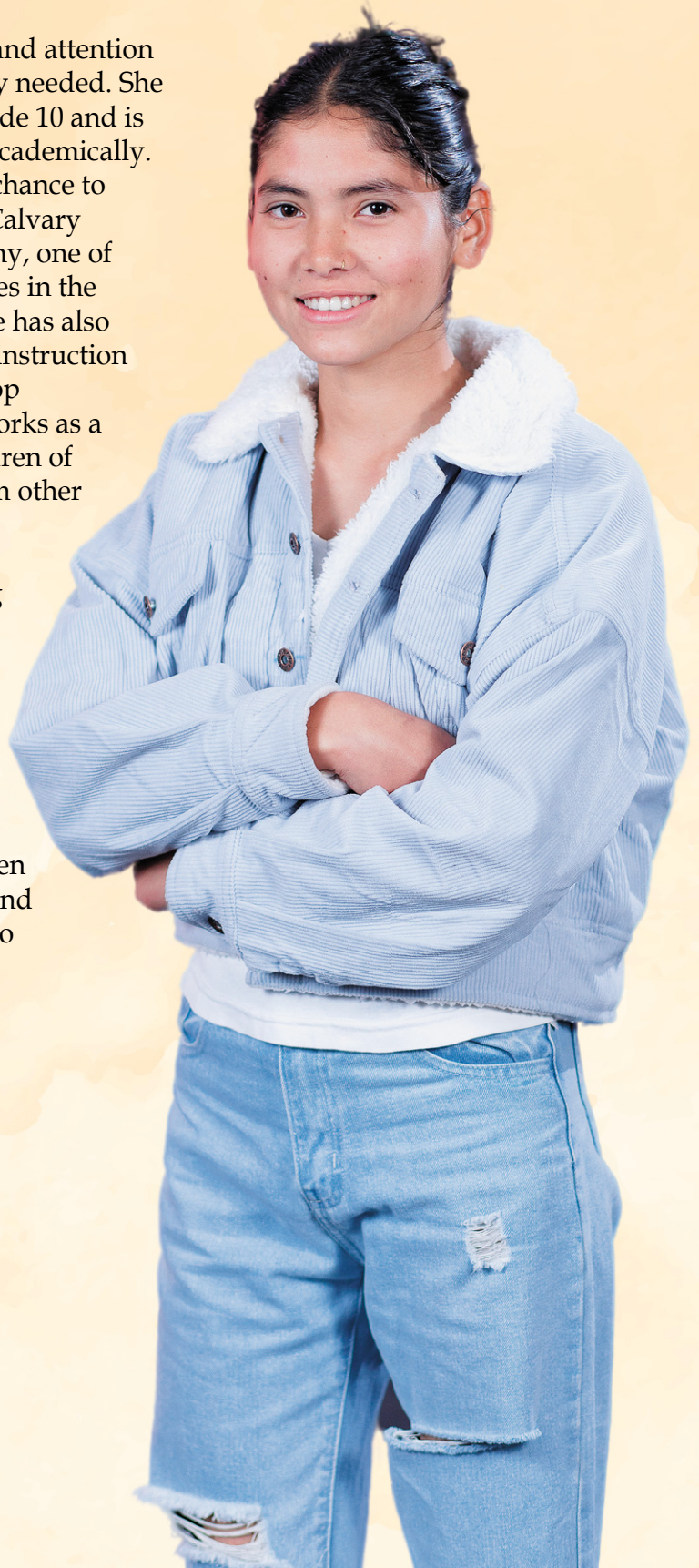
One of the most painful and challenging experiences for a child can be to grow up without parents. When Geeta Khatri's parents abandoned her in a remote area of western Nepal, she was unable to obtain an education or wholesome nourishment, and there was a significant chance that she would be exploited and trafficked.

Geeta always felt empty and missed her parents, especially witnessing other children who had their parents' undivided love and attention. She dreamed of being able to wear a school uniform and have a school bag full of books. And her elderly grandparents were able to provide only two small meals a day, which were insufficient for her growing body.

Geeta was given the opportunity to join LHFN and has never looked back. She has grown up surrounded by a family of numerous sisters and loving house mothers who give

her the affection and attention she so desperately needed. She is studying in grade 10 and is doing very well academically. She now has the chance to study abroad at Calvary Christian Academy, one of the top universities in the United States. She has also received English instruction from one of the top educators who works as a tutor for the children of ambassadors from other nations.

Geeta was among the most helpless children, living in a world of darkness and despair. But now she is taking full advantage of the opportunities given to her by LHFN and we are so proud to watch her grow.



## ANJALI PARIYAR

Anjali Pariyar is from Bardiya, one of Nepal's least developed regions, which suffers from extreme poverty and hardship. Most of the men in this region leave their families behind in search of work abroad. Anjali's parents passed away when she and her siblings were very young. Her sister was subsequently sold into slavery in India and there was a high chance that Anjali would meet the same fate.

Anjali was taken to LHFN after being rescued from her village, along with her three sisters. She is presently in Grade 7 at Christian Community School. She is overjoyed to be under the care of LHFN because she has access to everything she needs to grow and improve. She is putting a lot of effort into her goal of becoming a flight hostess, and she has been studying incredibly diligently. For her safe future, LHFN regularly offers her help and guidance. She is extremely appreciative of LHFN for making an investment in her life and providing her with the chances she has been receiving here at LHFN.

## SAMUEL TAMANG

In April 2015, a devastating earthquake struck Nepal, killing thousands and destroying the lives of many more. Samuel was only 7 months old when his mother, in desperation following the loss of everything she had, was forced to abandon him at the LHFN-run Miriam Baby Center. Since that moment, LHFN has been Samuel's family, providing him with a loving environment and all of the resources he needs to grow.

Even though he was too young to understand what was happening when he was handed over to LHFN, as he has grown older, he has come to understand the love and care that the LHFN house parents showed when nobody else wanted him. Today, that abandoned child is a hardworking student in Grade 3 at Christian Community School who aspires to be a successful police officer in the future. "Without LHFN, I could not have imagined where my life would go or even if I would survive at all. I will always be indebted to the LHFN family for saving my life, believing in me, and showing me that I am valuable."



## KAPIL MAHAT

The youngest of three siblings, Kapil was born in a remote and extremely impoverished village in Jumla District in northwest Nepal. Following the death of his father when Kapil was only 3, Kapil's mother was no longer able to provide adequate support for Kapil and his two older sisters. They were barely able to eat enough to survive, and going to school was just a dream.

Kapil's mother approached the Child Welfare Council in Jumla, who arranged for Kapil to move to Action Love Nepal (ALN), a small and loving children's home in Kathmandu founded by a good friend of our partners at The Nepal Initiative. When ALN was forced by the government to close in 2022, we opened our doors to Kapil and four of the other children living there.

Kapil is now in eighth grade and dreams of becoming an accountant or a doctor. He is also an accomplished sportsman, participating in as many activities as possible. He has integrated seamlessly into the LHFN family since joining us and is flourishing with the support and facilities we are able to provide.

# CHILDREN'S SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

## THE TOTAL TRANSFORMATION COMES ONLY FROM JESUS AND THE WORD OF GOD

LHFN was founded with the mission to influence children with the Word of God and form Disciples of Christ. As LHFN children began to know the Lord Jesus, this vision has come pass. As the number of baptized children has increased gradually, they have made Jesus known to their friends, locals and everyone in the neighborhood.

## ACTIVITIES FOR CHILDREN'S SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Regular activities for the spiritual growth of children have included weekly Church assembly, daily devotion at the hostel, and personal bible study and prayer. Not only that, but the children and staff of LHFN have been devotedly participating in the Disciple Making Movement (DMM). Within the two hostels and all of the personnel, thirteen separate groups have developed.

Staff from LHFN's Hostel and Administration departments have been actively teaching the children of LHFN into God's Word and working for

His Kingdom. Along with this report, many Groups with their own Leaders and Disciples have been present.

Our children have also been participating in a youth event organized by one of our neighbor churches called, "Warrior of Christ". Every three months this event is being organized and its major goal is to encourage teenagers



to participate in church activities in any way they could by using their gifts. The youngsters were trained in numerous subjects on a variety of issues such as: Why do we need to support our church leaders? Why do we need to be Christ-centered? What is the significance of Bible study, and how can youth share the gospel with their peers and why they need to do so?

All of our LHFN children took part and acquired new skills. Overall, this youth program

has been a blessing and a means for our children to learn new things.

It has been a really wonderful time as we have begun a home church in the LHFN facility for all of the LHFN personnel and children. They have been gathered there for the past two weeks and have been engaging in worship. Girls are taking on leadership roles and engaging

in various events such as Psalm reading, worship, tithe collection, and so on. It has been an excellent chance for them to learn and develop in Christ.

God's work has been enormously accomplished among the youths of LHFN. They have grown and become entrenched in God's Word. The primary purpose of LHFN has been met: all children are growing in their faith in the Lord.

## HEALING & LEARNING CENTRE, ULLERI

We were blessed in 2023 to be granted ownership of a property in Ulleri, a small village in the mountains close to Pokhara, on the Annapurna Circuit. The building contains a small library and a number of guest rooms (it was previously operated as a tourist guesthouse). We plan to develop it into a residential healing and learning center,

which will provide a safe space for our children to unwind away from the noise of the city and receive counselling and spiritual healing as needed. We hope the children will take the opportunity to expand their learning in a different environment to that back in Kathmandu.

## Martha Gahatraj

I'm Martha Gahatraj, and I'm 22 years old. My story started when I was just six years old and joined Light House Foundation Nepal, where I spent 11 years of my life finding my destiny.

Ever since Ps. Raju Sundas introduced me to LHFN, it has been a home and a huge influence in my life. The main reason I was at LHFN was because my family – my mother, father, and two siblings – was experiencing financial trouble. We suffered from financial hardship, and my father's long-term chronic illnesses – diabetes mellitus and asthma – prevented him from being able to support us and send us to school.

By God's grace, I was led to LHFN, Surkhet, Chhinchu Hostel, where I had the opportunity to progress spiritually, academically, and physically in all areas of my life. I finished my elementary schooling at LHFN in 2015.

My family's financial situation had hindered me from pursuing my dream to become a nurse. But God instructed me not to worry about whether I would be able to attend nursing school

when I graduated from high school. I heard God's voice one night informing me that I had this verse (Jeremiah 29:11) and that he had a plan for my life and future.

It was then that I understood I had been chosen by God, even though I had been an undesired and unexpected child in my mother's womb, I had grown to be most desirable and lovely in God's eyes.

With the grace of God, I started nursing school. I was awarded full scholarship money, out of 12,000 students for the CEE exam, and I am currently employed in Nepal as a licensed nurse. I know that without God's help, I could not have achieved this, thus I am thankful for His guidance. I am extremely appreciative of LHFN and Jesus Christ for making possible what seemed out of reach.

# REJINA B.K.

I am Rejina B.K from Surkhet. I am from an extremely impoverished household. My father used to drink alcohol excessively, which caused conflict in our household. I was small for my age because of our family issues and poverty. My parents were not providing me with a proper education. I was eager to come up with new ideas.

My mother couldn't even purchase a book for me and my siblings because she had so many children. Our family's situation was dire. It was difficult to eat twice a day. Our father never looked after us when he was alive, and he died after a few years. I was depressed and our family's situation was deteriorating day by day. Our neighbors were prejudiced against us and refused to let their children play with me. At a young age, I was mentally and socially frustrated. Like most youngsters my age, I preferred to have clothes, an education, affection, and caring assistance.

My mother worked non-stop just to feed me and my two siblings, but she was unable to educate us adequately. I also used to assist her at work.

On day, I was introduced to LHFN. Though I was too

small to comprehend fully the services that LHFN provides to those in need, I informed my mother that this organization cares for and educates impoverished children like me. And thus, on the 27th of Poush 2068, my adventure began at the LHFN gate. I was ecstatic and overjoyed. I eventually finished tenth grade with LHFN, which provided me with the best experience of love, support, and education. The people who work at LHFN are wonderful and considerate. LHFN's setting feels like a home for every child who lives here with me. With the support of LHFN, I completed my SEE with a 3.95 GPA (A+).

My long-term goal is to work in medicine. LHFN is once again assisting me in realizing my dream. Now that I've completed my General Medicine studies at the Education Development Academy (SEDA), LHFN is supporting me with my next degree, and their financial assistance motivates me to work and study even harder. I'd like to thank LHFN for their unbending love and support, and I'd be delighted to assist them in any way I can in the future.

# USHA BASHYAL

I am Usha Bashyal from the mid-western region of Nepal. I grew up in an extremely impoverished environment, where my mother was the only caregiver for five children. My father and my five sisters left my mother when I was quite tiny. It was a very difficult period for my mother to provide us with a decent education and means of subsistence. Still, she put in a lot of work and forced me to study through grade 12. My desire to serve others led me to pursue additional nursing studies. But because of the poor state of the economy, I was forced to stop going to school.

Nevertheless, as they say, "Where there is a will, there is a way." The same thing occurred in my life, and for that, I am incredibly appreciative to Light House Foundation Nepal, which helped me realize my dream by funding my education.

I thought my life had finished when my husband passed away. With my two tiny children, I felt as though I had nowhere to go. They were only beginning to develop. My hope began to fade, and I thought I had no hope nor direction in life. Light House Foundation Nepal offered me a job as a mother of not just two children but many other children in the hostel, which provided me hope and strength at that terrible moment. It was the year that LHFN had barely gotten underway. Ever since that day, I have been working extremely hard here.

Since I began working here, I have progressively grown to have a heart for helping others, which has led me to recognize that I was meant to be a mother to many people who were abandoned and had little chance in life, in addition to my two own children.

In addition to giving me and my kids a place to live, Light House Foundation Nepal has also given them access to a healthy atmosphere in which to learn. After completing her 12th grade, my daughter is currently employed. With funding from LHFN, my kid is presently enrolled in Christian Community School's tenth grade.

When I joined LHFN and began working for children's welfare, all of my fragmented dreams and hope were restored. Being among the oldest employees in this company makes me very proud. Children that have come here and graduated have made growth that I have witnessed. Many children and employees like me have found refuge at Light House Foundation Nepal. The investment and opportunity that LHFN made in my life has made me and my children what we are today.

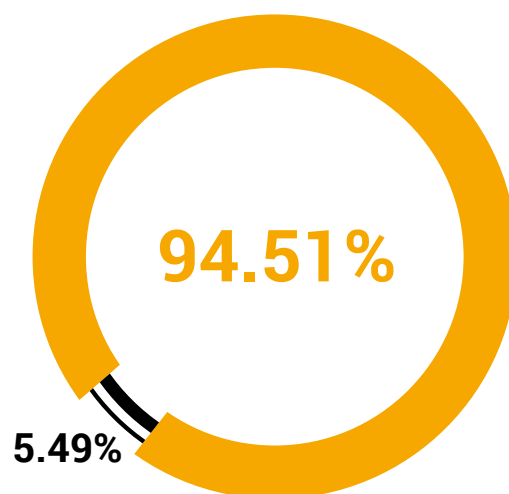
